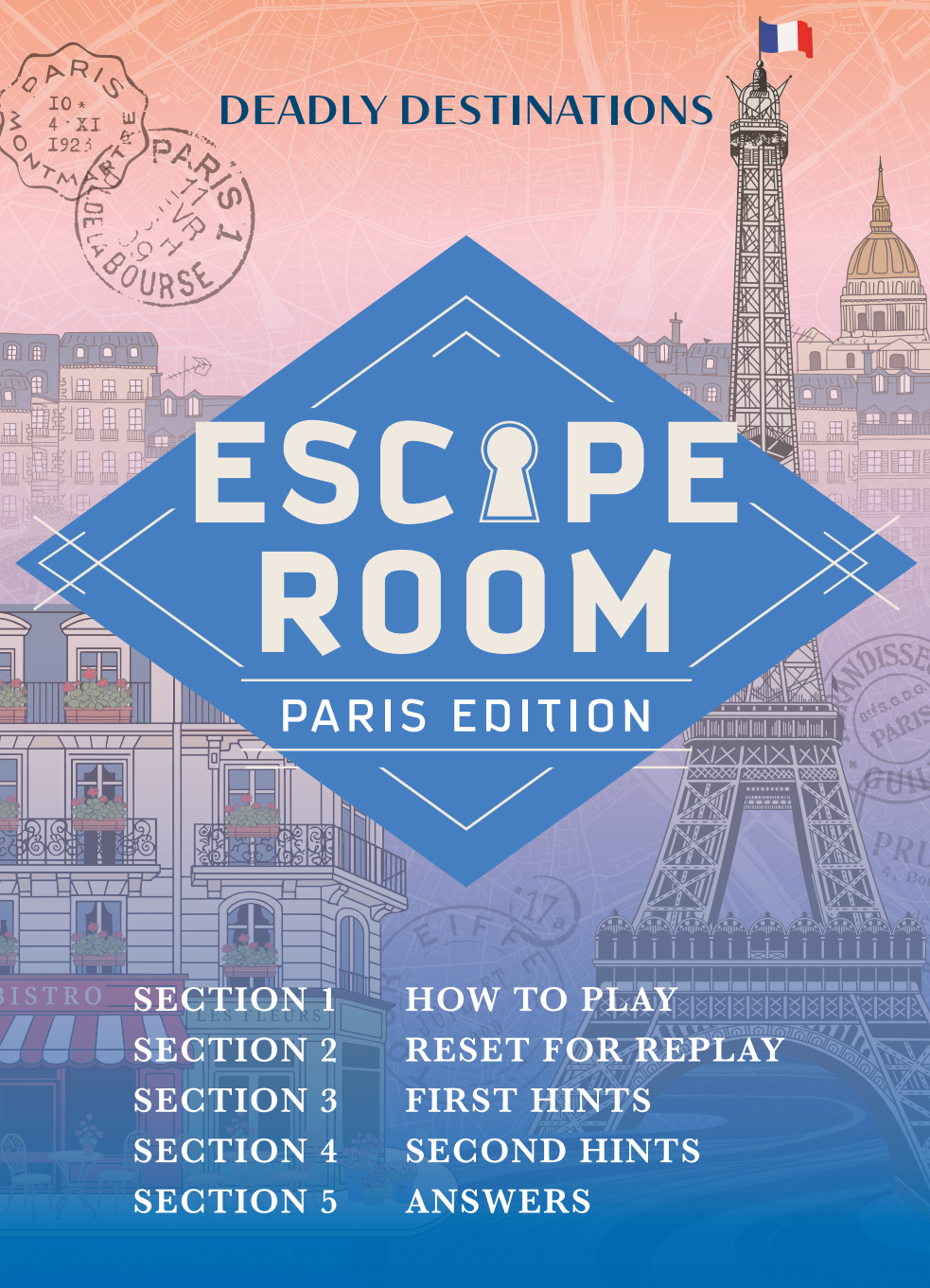

SECTION 1

HOW TO PLAY

- Start by handing out a pencil to each player.
- Make sure there is enough space for everyone to sit together and share clues.
- You can make notes during the game on the notepaper included.
- Some puzzles may need to be written on. We suggest using pencil, and pressing lightly, so that any mistakes can be rubbed out and written over, or using the tracing paper included.
- You may use your phone during the game to scan the QR codes and access a calculator.
- Lots of hints are included to make this game accessible and enjoyable for a range of skill levels. If your team is struggling, don't be shy about consulting the hints in Section 3 and Section 4 of this booklet.

More on the next page...

- Work together to uncover the truth behind Juliette Moreau's disappearance. Follow the clues she left behind, solve a series of challenges, and expose the secret that made her restaurant famous. Then track her through the streets of Paris and find her hiding place before it's too late.
- The introduction video will introduce you further to the storyline and instruct you on your mission.
- The game is divided into three parts, each representing a different stage of the investigation. In each one, you must solve three puzzles to uncover three answers. These answers will then come together in some way to give one final solution for that stage.
- Solve all puzzles in one envelope before moving onto the next. Your journey begins in Juliette's Secret.
- Use the QR code inside the game to input your answers in the online answer page and discover if you have escaped.
- You can check your answers in Section 5 of this booklet.

Begin the game now - scan the QR code on the inside box cover to watch the introduction video.

SECTION 2

HOW TO RESET FOR REPLAY

It is likely that you and your team will write on the puzzles during the game. We suggest using pencil wherever you can, so you can rub everything out easily if needed.

Alternatively, by using a combination of the notepad and tracing paper to work out the answers, the components can then be re-used.

SECTION 3

FIRST HINTS

(To help a little)

1. JULIETTE'S SECRET NEWSPAPER

The article may look ordinary... but try changing how you view it.

CCTV STILL

Make sure the images are in the correct time order before looking for anything else. Once they are properly arranged, pay close attention to the smallest details within each frame.

NAPKIN

This is a substitution cryptogram. Each letter consistently stands in for another. Start by testing likely short words. As you confirm letters, reuse them to gradually unlock the rest of the message.

2. BEHIND CLOSED DOORS

SPECIALS BOARD

Several words have been scrubbed from the menu. Use your knowledge of classic French dishes to restore them - think of well-known combinations you've seen before. Once you've completed the dishes, consider where else those specific answers might connect to something else in this round.

WINE LIST

The clues connect the wines together in a chain of relationships. Rather than guessing, write down what each statement tells you and link them step by step.

Look for a good place to start - for example, when one wine is 'half' or 'a third' of another, that gives you a mathematical relationship. The 'two years younger' and 'three years after' clues help anchor exact differences.

PLAYLIST EMAIL

The game has its own soundtrack. If you haven't explored it yet, now might be the time.

CODE 2 - THE ELIXIR

You now have three key words from this round. Each one replaces an icon in the web address shown. Make sure you insert them in the correct order - once completed, the link will lead you somewhere important.

FIRST HINTS

PART TWO

3. THE HUNT FOR JULIETTE

EIFFEL TOWER

Perspective changes everything. The tower won't reveal much on its own - it only begins to make sense when placed over the surrounding map. Once aligned correctly, reconsider how you're looking at it. The number is visible from the right vantage point.

LOUVRE

You'll need to use the split pins here. The dials must form the correct version of the Mona Lisa. Take your time aligning her eyes, nose and mouth properly. When the portrait is accurate, something else appears.

NOTRE-DAME

These aren't complex calculations - but they require careful logic and patience. Solve each small puzzle first.

1. Date Puzzle

Treat each date as six separate digits.

2. Alphabet Without Vowels

Remove A, E, I, O and U from

the alphabet completely - then count P's new position.

3. Month Code

Each number combines the month's position in the year with something else about the month.

4. Number Pattern

The first and third digits stay the same - focus on how the other two digits are created from them.

5. Key 13 7 1

Use the key as letter positions in the alphabet - then apply the same system to decode the numbers.

6. Sequence

Think about the number of letters in something very familiar that follows a weekly pattern.

CODE 3 - THE HIDEOUT

Add together the three numbers you have found from the Paris landmarks. This total narrows your search.

Then turn your attention to the postmarks inside the third envelope - they correspond to somewhere specific in Paris.

SECTION 4

SECOND HINTS

(To help a bit more)

1. JULIETTE'S SECRET NEWSPAPER

Some letters will only reveal themselves when the page meets the light.

CCTV STILL

Once the photos are in time order, use the yellow seconds and convert them into letters (A=1).

NAPKIN

The message begins with a name you already know - the chef herself.

2. BEHIND CLOSED DOORS

SPECIALS BOARD

After restoring the classic dishes, match them to the small logo icons printed on the back of the Wine List.

WINE LIST

The oldest of the wines is twelve years old.

PLAYLIST EMAIL

You'll find a QR code linking to DJ Bastien's playlist at the start of this booklet. Look for three song titles relating to the seasons - which season is missing?

CODE 2 - THE ELIXIR

The markings on the restaurant walls correspond with those on the envelope. Imagine each matching pair overlaid, beginning at the dot. You're looking for an eight-letter word.

3. THE HUNT FOR JULIETTE

EIFFEL TOWER

Tear along the perforation, align the tower over the map, then look down through it. Read the number starting on the left, then continue clockwise.

LOUVRE

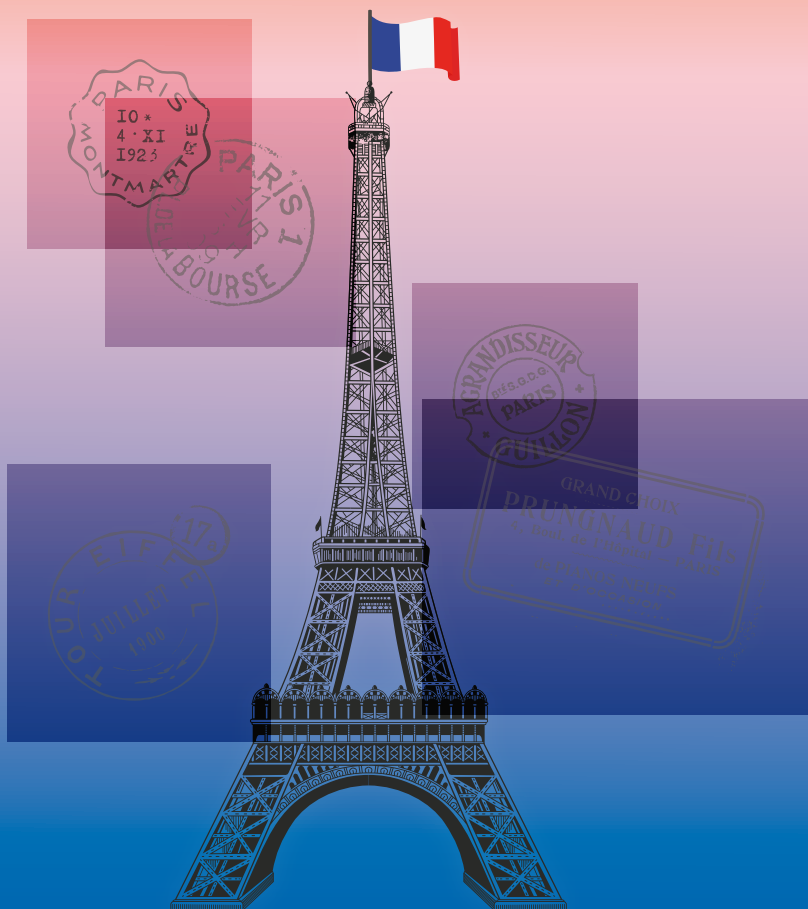
Attach the dials to the back of the Mona Lisa using the split pins. When her features are aligned correctly, four numbers appear - read top to bottom.

NOTRE-DAME

Fill the outer ring before moving inward as shown in the example. Combine neighbouring numbers to create the inner ring - only the coloured shapes need to be filled in. Once complete, separate the even and odd totals before bringing them back together in one final calculation.

SECTION 5

ANSWERS



1. JULIETTE'S SECRET

NEWSPAPER

Hold the newspaper to the light to reveal eight highlighted letters. Read in order, they spell:
MONSIEUR.

CCTV STILLS

Arrange the photos using the time stamps in the top right corner. Take the yellow-highlighted seconds and convert them using A=1 to uncover:
HENRI.

NAPKIN

Solve the substitution cryptogram by testing likely words and using confirmed letters to decode the rest. The full message reveals:
DUPONT.

CODE 1 - THE NAME

Combine the three parts to reveal the critic's name:
MONSIEUR HENRI DUPONT.

Scan the **QR** code inside the first envelope to access the case file and enter this name.

2. BEHIND CLOSED DOORS

SPECIALS BOARD

Complete the missing words from the classic French dishes. Match each to the symbols on the back of the Wine List and take the letters beside the icons to reveal:
SECRET.

WINE LIST

Solve the logic puzzle to determine the wine ages:

Champagne – 12

Bordeaux – 10

Chablis – 7

Burgundy – 6

Provence Rosé – 2

The median vintage is:

CHABLIS.

PLAYLIST EMAIL

Access the Paris playlist via the **QR** code on the inside front cover of this booklet. The seasonal songs included are:

April in Paris (Spring)

Paris Summer

Snowing in Paris (Winter)

The missing season is:

AUTUMN.

CODE 2 - THE ELIXIR

You now have three key words from this round. Use them to complete the web address shown inside the second envelope by substituting in the answers where the icons are:



talkingtables.co.uk/pages/secret-chablis-autumn

Enter the address to step inside the dining room of L'Étoile Cachée. On the walls you will see markings like those printed inside envelope 2. Both sets include a small dot beneath the first character - this shows you where to begin.

Starting at the marked symbol, move clockwise around the room. Match each character on the envelope with its corresponding partner on the dining room walls. When the two parts are overlaid, they form a complete letter. Continue pairing each symbol in order until the full word is revealed.

The name of Juliette's elixir is:
EUPHORIA.

Enter this as your second answer on the online case file.

3. THE HUNT FOR JULIETTE

ETIFFEL TOWER

Remove the top section of the tower and assemble the 3D base. Position it over the aerial map, carefully aligning the coloured guide lines.

Look down through the tower from above. The grey structural lines connect with the garden pathways below, forming block-style numerals. These reveal:
1889.

LOUVRE

Use the split pins to attach the three circular dials to the back of the Mona Lisa painting so that the eyes, noses and mouths can be seen through the gaps. Turn each dial until you land on the correct features - then look at the numbers that appear in the square windows. From top to bottom, they read:
1797.

NOTRE-DAME

Solve the six logic puzzles. Each answer is a number:

1: 25, 2: 12, 3: 531, 4: 5724, 5: 41, 6: 8.

Complete the outer and inner circles using the answers. Then add together all the even numbers in the inner ring, and separately add all the odd numbers. Multiply those two totals to find:

$$(7+3+9+9) \times (8+6+8+6) = 784.$$

CODE 3 - THE HIDEOUT

Add together the three landmark numbers: $1889 + 1797 + 784 = 4470$.

Look at the postage marks inside the third envelope. Match the area code to the corresponding Paris neighbourhood.

Juliette's hiding place is:
MONTMARTRE.

Enter this as your third and final answer on the online case file.
